**Dear friends and fellow travelers in the world of books and the West.** This is our second catalogue of 100 books produced this year. We also have many books outside the field of Western Americana. They post almost immediately on our website and the sites on which we sell our books.

Early this year your bookseller also published his own book, Roger Patterson's Snowman Book. It is a 119pp. bibliography with essays on book collecting and the significance of the first book published and entirely devoted to the subject of Bigfoot / sasquatch in North America. In 1966 Roger Patterson's Do Abominable Snowmen of America Really Exist? was first published. You may recognize Patterson as the person who, along with his colleague, Bob Gimlin, filmed a female sasquatch in northern California in 1967. Interestingly, the film and its subject have withstood rigorous high tech analysis from people highly skilled in the film and costume industry.

As to this catalogue, it is our usual fare of fine books on the American and (sometimes) Canadian West and more broadly the frontier experience. However, I suppose that the marriage, bibliographically speaking, between books on the West and books on Bigfoot does not get any better than our item #64. It is a small and rare 1896 northern California book which reprints a 1886 newspaper report relating the sighting of what was sounds like a Bigfoot / sasquatch. While there are quite a number of printed reports of wild men and/or sasquatch –type creatures dating back to David Thompson's 1807 western Canadian expedition, and even earlier, this 1896 book is considered the first book (as a published bound volume) to include a sasquatch report.

As is also usual, the catalogue is populated with books that are relatively common, books that are unusual and scarce, and books that are very scarce or rare.
